All proceeds will be split between the charities Action Medical Research and the Assembly Hall extension fund. Come and have a fun evening while helping these good causes!!


Early warning !! Quiz !! On Saturday 12th February 2022

Countryside Notes (December – January)

At the time of writing I'm enjoying another Autumn time warm spell, gentle breeze, day and night temperatures in low tens! By the time you read this though I really expect the temperature to have changed. There has been indications that may indicate harder times to come. Peanut butter and fat balls that I provide for lots of small birds have needed refilling every few days as though the birds are preparing for a hard time. One of the camera nest boxes for Tits has had an overnight rooster on a very regular basis since September, booking its winter residence in good time. Often a winter rooster turns into a nesting parent in the Spring. The cameras are linked to a television close to our dining table and provide us with detailed viewing of nest building, incubating, hatching through to fledging if we're lucky. Sometimes we have to witness disasters, parent coming in wet and cold or a Woodpecker reaching in and the loss of all baby birds

Another possible indicator of weather to come has been the greater than normal clusters of berries on the Holly tree. These generally remain untouched until the New Year when Fieldfares arrive in flocks and within days manage to strip the trees. Still as I write it's 11°C.

The fish in the pond are still coming up for food and the strawberries in hanging baskets in an unheated but lined greenhouse continue to ripen. They provide a weekly desert combined with the last pickings of summer raspberries. Will we have any time left for Winter? I guess so and I look forward to conveying some observations again
