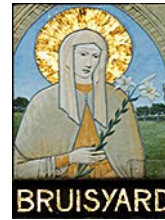

## Countryside Notes



My last article mentioned how the water lilies in the pond reacted to drought. Well, it's happened. Water level has dropped over a foot. The lily leaves stand up and conceal the flowers. It takes a lot of rain to restore the water level. The picture shows what was two small lily roots now spread across the pond taken before the water level dropped. In the workshop, you can



see 200 handles made for large rubber stamps used by HMSO and the NHS. Turnings can also be large, 24" diameter such as this laminated central column for a circular dining table.
